#### **EVENT DETAILS**

# Who can take part?

The event is for pupils in years 5 to 13 inclusive (P5-S6 in Scotland) but note that it is the pupil's date of birth that determines the class they enter, not necessarily their school year. Classes are denoted by National Curriculum School Years (e.g., G7 means Girls Year 7 or S1/P7 in Scotland) but date of birth is the key entry criteria.

Further information on dates of birth etc may be found in Table 1 below, especially for the Scottish School years which are different to those in England, Wales and Northern Ireland

Schools do not have to be members of the British Schools Orienteering Association to enter. It is not necessary for a member of the school staff to accompany the team, but the team must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

#### **Pairs**

Pupils in Years 5 to 8 may compete in pairs.

- If a pair comes from different years, then they must be entered as the higher year.
- If they are not the same gender, then they should be entered as boys.

Pairs must stay together and cross the finish line together.

#### **School Categories**

As this is a school event, ideally all entries should be made through your school. Home schooled children should include the words 'home school 'in the school's name.

Competitors should have competed in at least three orienteering events at the appropriate standard before the Schools Championships.

### Parking, Event Centre, Facilities, Finish and Starts

Vehicles will be parked on hard standing at the front (east side) of <u>Hopetoun House</u>. Coaches and minibuses will be accommodated in the same car park (please indicate if you will be bringing a coach or minibus when entering the event). There is no height barrier on entry.

Parking charges (TBC and collected on the day). Coaches £10, Minibuses £5, Cars £3

# Location data (main estate gate)

Although the location data for the main entrance to Hopetoun House are given above, **YOU MUST follow the travel directions given below**, to avoid ending up at the wrong (closed) estate gate.

From the South or North: use the motorway system to access the M90 and exit the M90 at junction 1A, just south of the Queensferry Crossing bridge across the Firth of Forth. At junction 1A take the A904 east, signposted Queensferry and Kirkliston and then immediately turn left at traffic lights onto the B924, following the Hopetoun House brown sign. Follow this road through the residential area for approx 0.8 miles then turn left onto Farquhar Terrace (Post Code for Sat Nav EH30 9RT) following a grey Hopetoun House sign and an orienteering sign (the junction is right under the approach road for the old Forth Road Bridge). Follow this road for 1.5 miles to the main gate of Hopetoun House. NB The first half mile of this road follows a fairly narrow residential street and then a narrow country road for 1 mile, but the locals are used to coaches coming and going.

#### From the East

- From NW Edinburgh take the A90 Queensferry Road which merges onto the M90 then take the first exit 1A and proceed as above
- From the northern end of the Edinburgh City Bypass (A720), turn right at the Gogar roundabout then take a left onto the A902 signed Forth Road Bridge. After 1.2 miles turn left onto the A90 which after 3.5 miles merges onto the M90 then take the first exit 1A and proceed as above

### From the West

- From the M8 at junction 2 merge onto the M9 then the M90, proceed as above
- From the M9 exit at junction 2, turn left, and then turn right onto the A904. Proceed for 3.5 miles to the next major roundabout, go straight ahead and then immediately turn left at

traffic lights onto the B924, following the Hopetoun House brown sign. Proceed as above NB Do not follow the brown signs for the Hopetoun House Farm Shop or Gardens (1 mile after leaving the M9)

# **Event Layout and Facilities (to be confirmed in the Final Details)**

Download and Enquiries will be in a dedicated building, on the north side of Hopetoun House and close to the car/coach park. Look out for the green ESOC sail banner and follow the Orienteering signs.

The Assembly Area, Start and Finish will all be close, and signed from, the coach/car park area

- Toilets are available in a separate building close to the Registration building and will be signed from the car/coach park.
- Club First aid cover will be on hand near to the Finish.
- There will also be free Maze for anyone to try.

# **Map and Control descriptions**

A waterproof five colour map at a scale of 1:7,500 with 5 metre contours, overprinted with the controls and control descriptions in written format. Separate, loose control descriptions will not be available.

A blank map will be emailed to each school with the final details.

### **Hopetoun House**

Hopetoun House is a historic stately home near South Queensferry and is one of the finest examples of the work of the Scottish architects Sir William Bruce and Robert Adam. Some of the TV show <u>Outlander</u> was filmed here. The house and grounds occupy a commanding position overlooking the Firth of Forth to the north.

The landscaped gardens around the house have a good network of paths and many interesting woodland features. The wider Deer Park provides fast running on contoured slopes, and possibly sightings of deer in the distance. Access between the two sections of the map is through compulsory marked crossing points, which will be manned. The "ha-ha" (a type of landscape design that serve as a vertical barrier) separating parts of the two sections is "uncrossable" too, and marked with a red line.

#### **Equipment Required**

Personal gear needs to be Orienteering kit or a T-shirt or long-sleeved shirt, tracksuit bottoms and trainers (or good grip-soled shoes). No Shorts or Jeans. Long sleeved shirts are recommended for the Orange, Light Green and Green courses. If the weather is bad, a waterproof jacket, cagoule, or something similar may be made compulsory.

A compass is strongly recommended, and whistles are compulsory.

#### SI Control Punching

The SI electronic punching system will be used, and SI cards will be provided at the event.

Competitors may use their own SI card, but this must be indicated on the entry form and the SI card used must match the card number shown on their competitor number label. If not, enquiries must be notified, and any changes made before the competitor starts. In the interests of fairness, the ability to punch "contactlessly" with your own SI card (i.e. active SIAC) will be disabled.

### **Awards**

Medals will be given to the first three individuals in each age class, the first three teams (of three) in each age class, and the first three schools in each category of school.

Participation Certificates will be awarded to all competitors.

### **Trophies**

Trophies will be presented to the winning school for each age class and the winning school in each category of school. If you hold a trophy from BSOC 2024 please return it to enquiries as soon as you arrive at the event.

### **Timings and Prize Giving**

The intended start period is from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm (TBC)

Prize giving will take place as early as possible, but provisionally should be at around 2.00 pm.

### Dogs

Dogs are welcome providing they are kept on a short lead in the parking area and around the estate. Dogs are not allowed on the courses or in Hopetoun House.
